# Council Patches from Chehaw Council and Southwest Georgia Council

A “council patch” is defined by *A History of Scouting Through Insignia - Arapaho I (Update)* as (1) a patch used for identifying the council and not an activity (except for a council anniversary or the bicentennial of the country in 1976), and, (2) the patch can not reference any activity such as a camp or camporee. The numbering system established by *Arapaho* states that when a council changes names but keeps the same council number the numbering sequence for council patches continues rather than restarting. Council patches are referred to as “CP.”

*Arapaho* identifies many council patches issued before 1981 and although, it is not a comprehensive list, it is the only reference list every produced. The Council Patch listing was never revised or updated in any later *Arapaho* edition; therefore, many patches are not listed.

This patch (CP 101) was used as the center patch for Camp Osborn rockers and other various Chehaw Council activity rockers from 1955? to 1969.

Rockers were added for camporees, summer camps and other activities, and honors.
