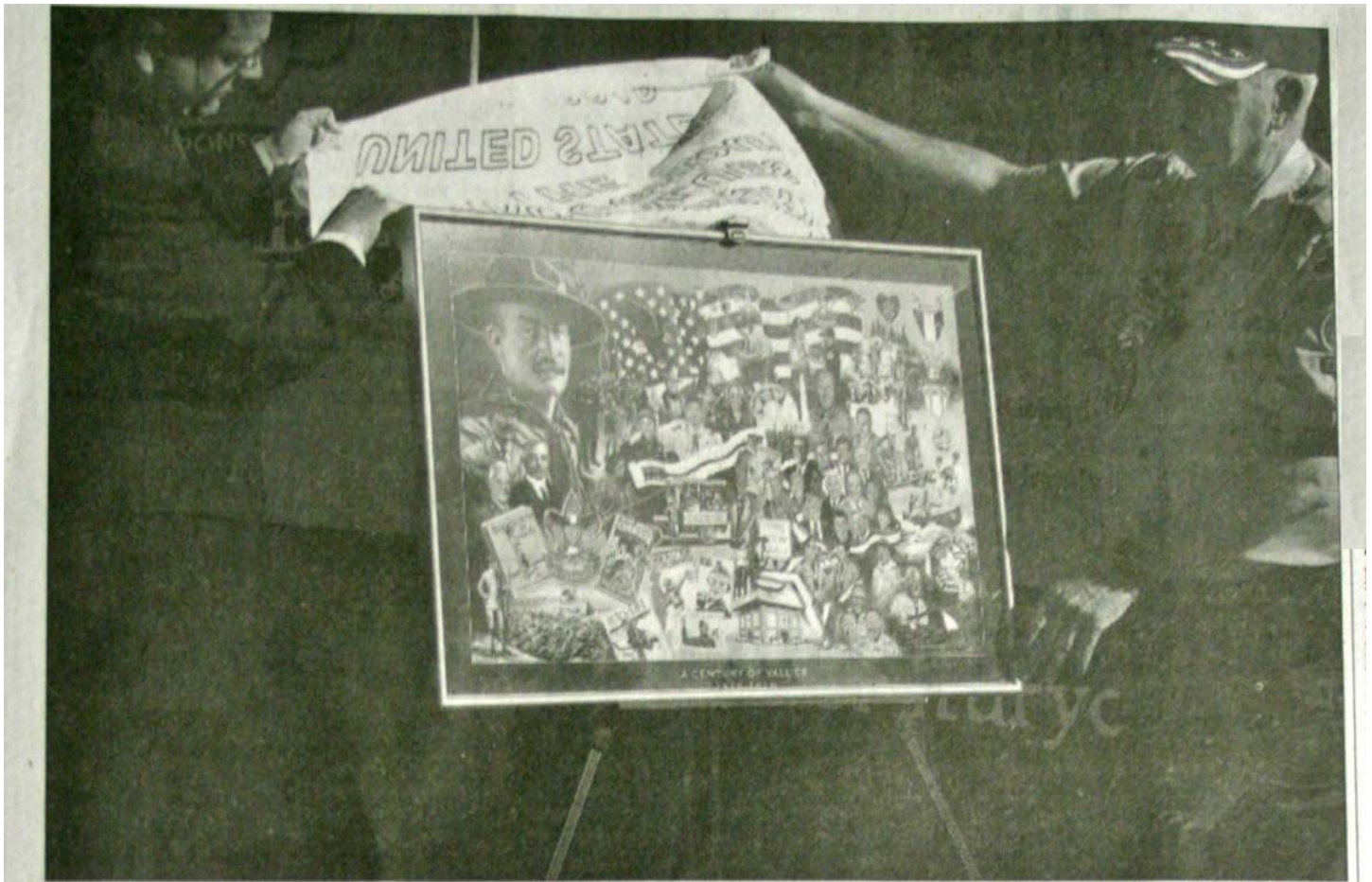

Scouts honor 'A Century of Values'

■ More than 12 road teams from Michigan are covering 45,000 miles to initiate the Boy Scouts of America's 100th anniversary celebration.

ALBANY — Since Feb. 8, a group of volunteers has been making two stops a day to various parts of the country to kickoff a celebration campaign — and it is only the beginning.

Driving a decorated vehicle and wearing the familiar green uniforms, 14 teams of adult leaders are conducting a nationwide tour to Boy Scout councils as part of an effort to kickoff the organization's 100th anniversary celebration.

The Chehaw Council, located on North Madison Street in Albany, was visited by one such team Monday as part of the campaign, titled "A Century of Values."

"This is the official start of the 100 year celebration," said Michael Greene,

chairman for the celebration committee. "We are making a big deal out of it."

Before leaving to make the tour's next stop, officials presented a mural, meant to depict key figures and events in scouting, to representatives from the Chehaw Council—something they are doing at every stop.

"We are not making a lot of stops, but we are driving a lot of miles," said Mauri Marshall, team chief for the group stopping in Albany. "We are advance cheerleaders for the 100-year celebration."

The Chehaw Council marked the 53rd stop on the tour. Before stopping in Albany, the team paid a visit to Valdosta Friday. The group planned to stop in Macon Monday afternoon.

The Albany stop marked the first of the tour's eighth week. The Chehaw Council is composed of 17 counties and 2,500 scouters.

"We are re-establishing the values for the next century," Greene said. "It certainly shows the mission is still relevant

today. We are as strong a scouting program as we ever had. We give credit to the people in Southwest Georgia that continue to support us; we are basically supported by donations. We always had a very strong council here."

With the actual anniversary being almost 10 months away, officials are still amping for a bigger celebration to come.

"We will begin to build enthusiasm for the campaign and kick off in full force in February 2010, the real anniversary," Greene said. "We will try

to have events locally and nationally."

The council moved to their North Madison location earlier this month. They were previously located on Mitchell Avenue. Based in Albany, the council was founded in 1939.

The tour was initiated in Laingsburg, Mich. last month, and will end with a stop to Irving, Texas at the National Boy Scout Museum in February 2010. There are more than 300 stops planned for the tour, one for each council nationwide. Overall, the tour will cover 45,000 miles.

ALBANY, GA (WALB) - Albany's Boy Scouts got an early start celebrating 100 years of values. A team of volunteer Scouts from around the country who are touring the nation made a stop at the new headquarters of North Madison.

The team will stop at each of the more than 300 Boy Scout headquarters around the nation. And they are already halfway through their tour. The team drives an RV dedicated to 100 years of developing values in young boys.

"The way we got to 100 years is a lot of dedicated volunteers, parents primarily that have supported the program, served as leaders and given them the program they need and want," said Team Chief, Mauri Marshall.

The team presented the Cheshaw Council with a special signed mural about the Scouts history. The Boy Scouts will turn 100 years old in February of next year.

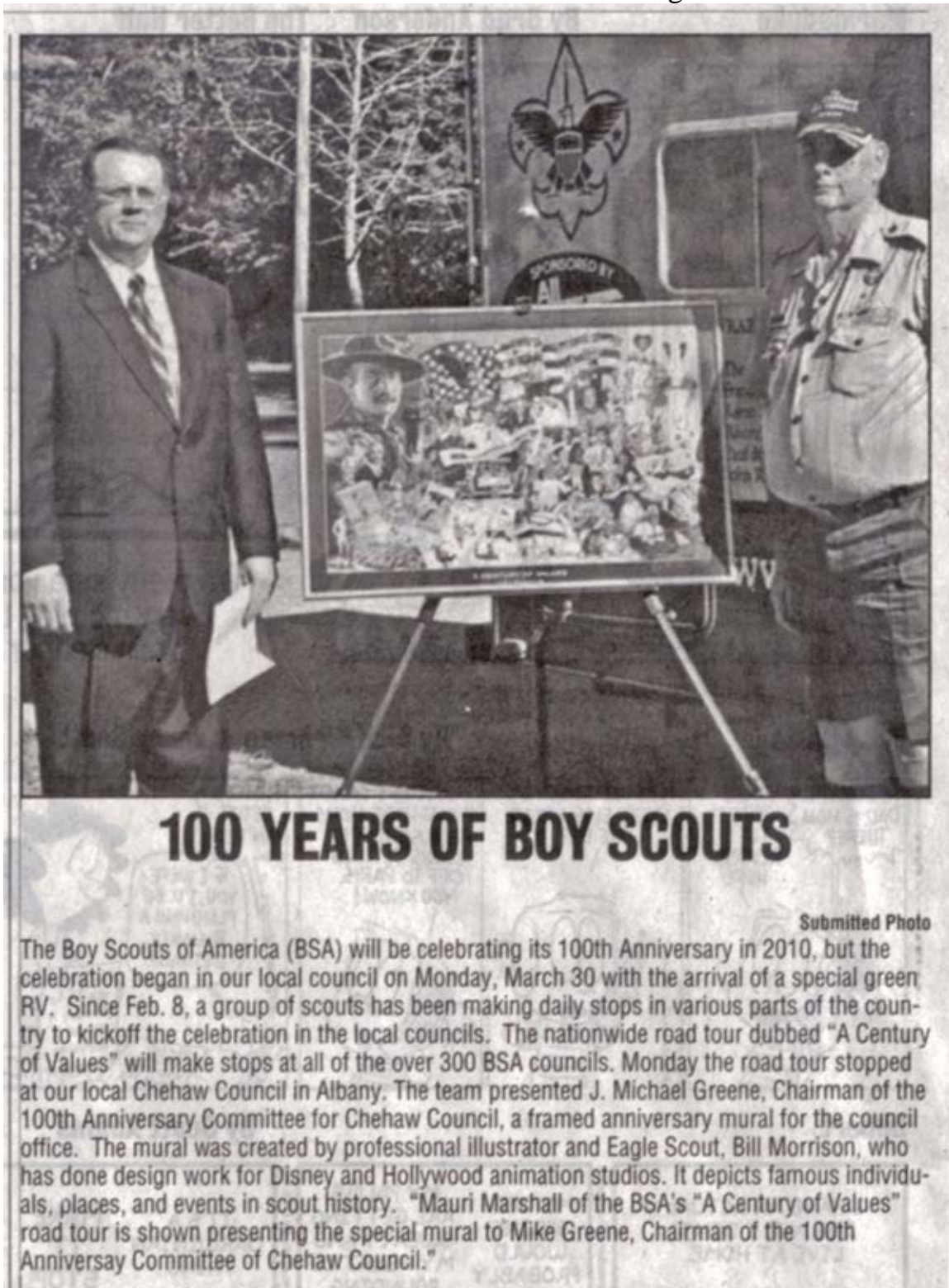
